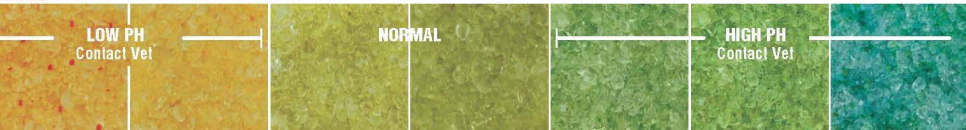

If you see your cat is distressed, it is critical for you to contact your cat's veterinarian even if the Ultra Monthly Monitor™ has not shown any abnormal colors. Please familiarize yourself with the common signs of feline illnesses and monitor your cat daily.

## EARLY DETECTION OF ILLNESS MAY SAVE YOUR CAT'S LIFE

### Use Ultra Monthly Monitor™ To Help Monitor Your Cat's Health

1. Evenly spread Ultra Monthly Monitor™ across the top of a newly filled litter box.
2. Within 10 minutes of your cat using the litter box, compare the color at the urination spot with the chart below.
  - If** the litter indicates a low pH (orange to red) or a high pH (dark green to blue) then it is recommended you contact your veterinarian.
  - If** the color is light gold to light green, this indicates your cat's urine is in the normal range.
- In a multi-cat household**, Separate the cats so each has its own litter box with Ultra Monthly Monitor™.
3. After inspecting for color changes, stir the Ultra Monthly Monitor™ into the litter so it will help control odors.
